# Welcome to the JUNE 2023 Newsletter

### **ANNUAL CONFERENCE**

Everyone enjoyed the function last year so we saw no reason to change the format; however, this year, there'll be a presentation by Chris Foley (CEO of APCO) who will address the broad issue of the need to increase the use of recycled materials in packaging.

## MEMBERSHIP

Our membership remains at 50. Earlier this year, Mike Perkins, due to ill health, sold his business (Planet Sales) to Tim Xenos (Bevpax) and we'll look forward to greeting Tim at the conference.

#### WEBSITE

The <u>minutes of the **March 2023** Board meeting</u> were approved by the Directors at the June meeting and have been posted on the website.

#### **SUPPLY AGREEMENTS**

Our agreement with **Visy Plastics** (for supply of PET bottles) is now in place, as are agreements with **AMEC Plastics** and **Big Springs Water**. We are still awaiting finalisation of agreements with **Visy Board** and for the supply of plastic closures.

# **RECYCLING AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS**

There continues to be growing pressure on food, beverage, and packaging industries (amongst others) to increase the use of recycled materials. Other matters that will affect almost all members will be the introduction of a health star rating system and an increased range of products and package sizes for inclusion in Compulsory Deposit Systems (CDS) for various states. I expect Chris Foley will provide some detail about these matters.

As previously advised, following last year's AGM, we decided not to continue our membership of the Australian Beverages Council (ABCL). On the other hand, in April, we thought it would be opportune to join the Australian Packaging Covenant Organisation (APCO) given their central role in recycling and sustainability and the information they provide on these matters, which, when appropriate, we can promulgate to members.

In these challenging times let's look forward to a more buoyant six months.
